## Room Reservations at Best Western Angus Inn

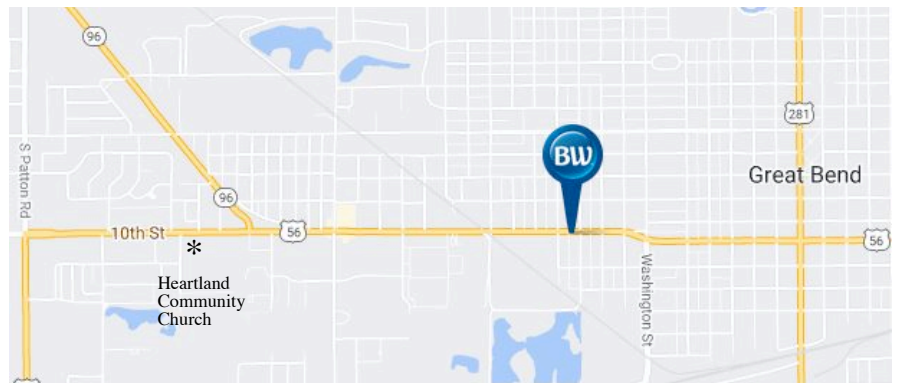

## Split Arrows Workshop Info

### Supply list:

Split Arrows pattern (\$12 in my shop or on the day of the workshop)

For this workshop, participants should cut the sashing fabric into 1" x WOF strips prior to the workshop

Participants should bring: cutting mat, ruler, rotary cutter, fat quarters as listed on pattern, sashing cut into 1" x WOF strips, sewing machine, thread, iron, wool mat or ironing board

Split Arrows is great for using medium scale or directional prints! This advanced beginner pattern looks great in any size!

# Fellowship Quilt Workshop with Laura Piland

## Finial Workshop Info

### Supply list:

Finial pattern (\$12 in my shop or on the day of the workshop)

For this workshop, participants should use the templates in the pattern to cut the background and finial fabrics prior to the workshop. This workshop is shorter in time, so having all the pieces for the quilt (including the bias tape strips) cut in advance would be wonderful. Instruction will be provided on cutting in the workshop if help is needed, though there may not be enough time to cut and sew during the workshop

Participants should bring: precut fabrics, pins, iron, wool mat or ironing board, 1/2" bias tape maker, sewing machine, thread

Fellowship Application is found on page 9.

You must register for it separate from the retreat.

The Fellowship Workshop will be held on Saturday afternoon of the retreat.

# KQO General Meeting Minutes

## Holiday Inn Campus, Manhattan, Kansas

### June 4, 2022

President Joy Schloctermeier called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m.

Minutes from the Salina meeting were approved as presented in the Spring newsletter.

Debbie Coddington gave the Treasurer's Report. The checking account balance as of 3/22/2022 was \$5,887.69 and the CD balance is \$11,950.09, maturing on 7/2/2023.

There was still \$1,400.00 due for the meeting rooms and meals in Manhattan. Tony Munoz moved that we approve the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Doris Santee. Motion approved.

Joy explained the \$20 incentive to recruit new and returning members for the Fall Meeting in Great Bend. Other ideas were presented to spread the word about KQO. Nancy Arnoldy suggested we really promote the meeting in our local guilds. Linda Sobba suggested getting a handout to the upcoming Wichita Quilt Show. It was also suggested we keep the website as up-to-date as possible with upcoming meetings and events.

After giving out a few door prizes, Joy reminded us to buy chances on the several guild opportunity quilts on display. A number of new members in attendance were asked to stand and were acknowledged.

Doris Santee gave a report on Golden Oldies, explaining the history of the group and our annual summer retreat the last weekend in July, most recently at the Webster Conference Center in Salina. The

retreat is available to current or former board members and is a weekend of friendship and sewing with most meals provided and dorm rooms available if you choose.

Joy explained that board members meet four times a year with officers and committees to be filled and asked for volunteers for election at the Fall Meeting. Doris had a card to sign for Jeannine Bryan, the long-time organizer for Golden Oldies, who is having health issues.

Linda Sobba updated us on the Fall Meeting plans to be held in Great Bend at the Heartland Community Church. Rooms will be available at the Best Western Angus Inn, 2920 10th St., 620-792-3541, and will be held until Sept. 15 for KQO. # Block Drawing Make Over

For this meeting, we are going to try something different for our block drawing! This year we are going to ask everyone to still turn in a block, but this time, it is to show our appreciation for our veterans. Using this pattern attached here or one of your own, we ask for 12 ½" finished size blocks using quality, adult-appropriate, 100% cotton, 'quilt-weight' fabrics. Avoid branch-specific prints (Army, Navy, etc) but we please ask that you use red, white, or blue in your blocks to give a general theme to the quilt. These blocks will then be collected and sewn together and donated this time around to the Dodge City Quilts of Valor group. If we choose to do this again for another meeting, we will then choose another Quilts of Valor group in Kansas to donate to. The quilt will be sewn together and donated from us all as a group. Please feel free to turn in more than one block if you choose we would love to see everyone participate. If enough blocks are turned in, we will make as many quilts as we can from the blocks. Let's share our love of quilting with those in Kansas that have given us our freedom! A very big thank you to all those who participate!

## Friendship Star Quilt Block Pattern

### 12" x 12" Friendship Star Cutting Chart

**Blue Print** for center

- (1) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" square

**Small Scale Red Print** for stars

- (2) 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" squares

**Light Neutral Print** for background

- (4) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares
- (2) 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" squares



### Assemble the Friendship Star Quilt Block



### For the 12" x 12" Friendship Star Quilt Block

1. Draw a diagonal line, from one corner to the opposite corner, on the reverse side of all light neutral squares.
2. Use the half-squared triangle method to sew a light square to each blue print square of the same

# Block Drawing Make Over, continued

- size. When complete, each of the four half-square triangle units should measure 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" for a 12" (finished size) quilt block. Set aside.
3. Make four more half square triangle units by pairing the remaining 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" light squares with the multicolored squares (for the block's corner triangles) of the same size.
  4. Arrange the half square triangle units and the 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" blue print square into three rows. Units made with the blue fabric from the stars, and the multicolor print triangle units are used in block corners. Check to make sure the angles of all patches match the diagram.
  5. Sew the units in each row together. Press seam allowances in the top and bottom rows towards the outer units. Press seam allowances in the center row towards the solid square.
  6. Sew rows together, carefully matching patch edges and seam intersections.
  7. Press. The quilt block should measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2".
