

Spring 2023 National Speaker—

Charlotte Angotti

While shopping with her mother in 1977, (really, that long ago!), Charlotte wandered into a quilt shop and everything

changed from there. Educated in fine arts, speech and drama, she brings a variety of talents to the class and in a most humorous way.

She has been teaching quilt making since 1978 because someone asked Charlotte to teach her. Her first quilt was sold right after making it. She has sold many since. In 1981



Charlotte opened a quilt shop, Quilt Works, in Virginia Beach, VA. She sold the shop in 1999.

She has been teaching nationally/internationally since 1991 and now lives in the Lafayette, LA area, moving there in 2016.

Quilt Maker's Studio was started when Charlotte realized there were a few left-over kits now and then. The 'orphan' kits are sometimes available on the website, but more often offered for sale in other classes as she travels. The kits are so popular it is difficult to get them online before they are sold! The kits are laser cut and go together perfectly. They make sewing a quilt simply as good as it gets.

It has been said many times, if you hear laughter coming from a room, there is a good chance Charlotteis in there. Charlotte is known for humor, her way with color and fabric, her pre-cut kits, and her book,

Charlotte is a fun person to have on a faculty or as a teacher coming to your guild. She believes her hobby is quiltmaking and her job is teaching others to enjoy it as much as she does.

Finally, a class that you know you have brought the right things for! In this fun-filled class, a kit of CUT fabrics is furnished. This is a wonderful group workshop for those that just want to sew and not have any cutting or thinking to do.

This class is the most popular class Charlotte offers. It fills quickly and is a SURPRISE in more ways than one. It is a mystery type class. No one gets any hints and yet those who take the class will want to take another. Each class is a different quilt. Rarely are the kits repeated. All kits in class are the same, there is no choice for the students. This is the type of class that works well at shows, because it lets the students have a great time plus have a successful project. It is also great for guilds where the students know each other and like to talk and don't usually get that chance in other classes. You are going to love it!

If you are a group hiring Charlotte, YOU will determine the price of the kit. That can range from \$125 (small) to as much as you want each kit to cost. The size will be determined by the fabric used and how it is cut. If, for example it is a complicated cut, the price is higher just for that part. The higher the price the larger the kit. The fabrics used in the kits are all top quality and with yardage prices being around \$12 per yard and up, the price of the kits reflects this cost.

Workshop Supply List

Basic sewing supplies: plus the following:

- seam ripper
- thread snips
- straight pins
- fabric scissors
- rotary cutter (with new blade or a sharp blade)
- cutting mat, large size
- square ruler, at least 12" square
- rectangular ruler, 6 x18 or 6x24
- optional ironing spray or starch, like Fresh Press.

<u>Sewing Machine</u> - include: power cords, foot pedal, machine feet, extra machine needles, matching thread, bobbins, scraps of fabrics for leaders and enders.

Iron & ironing board (Ironing station provided)

Fabric:

1 & 1/4 yard of striped fabric. The stripes should run parallel to the selvage edge. A colorful stripe fabric works great; small or moderate width stripes work well. Wide stripes usually don't give enough contrast and batik stripes are not usually squared and can't be aligned to make the blocks. **DO NOT PREWASH YOUR FABRIC**.

Other items not required but may benefit you:

- Water bottle, stay hydrated
- · Reading glasses
- Chocolate
- Seat cushion

KQO General Meeting Minutes Heartland Church, Great Bend KS

September 30 - October 1, 2022

President Joy Schlochtermeier called the meeting to order on Friday evening at 6:40 pm. Tony Munoz moved that we accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter, it was seconded, and motion passed.

Debbie Coddington gave the Treasurer's Report. Debbie informed us that there are only 7 members remaining on the USPS mailing list. Our current checking account is \$8,927.82 after income from dues and registrations of \$4,115.00 and expenses of \$6.72. The 15-month small business CD balance is \$11,950.09. The anticipated expenses for the Fall Meeting are \$1,000 for the meeting site and \$1,650 for teacher fees. The teacher mileage and lodging were still unknown. The meal expenses were also unknown as the church Youth Group was unable to provide meals at the last minute. Linda Sobba was able to find caterers for both days for lunch, with chicken wraps and a taco bar on the menu.

Joy asked that the current Board Members stand to be acknowledged. Leaving the board are Joy Schlochtermeier, Linda Sobba, Beth Coldwater, Jean Buchanan and Charlene Calhoon. Next, the board member candidates were asked to stand: Judy Komarek, Lynn Colquhoun, Amy Richards Rush, Angela DeVore and Jody Cheatum (Lynn and Jody were unable to attend). Penny Helderman moved that we accept the new slate of Board Members and was seconded by Tony Munoz. Motion passed.

Pam Calhoun announced that most of the Door Prizes are from the estate of Jeannine Bryan, the long-time Golden Oldies organizer. Thank you cards were included with each door prize. Several door prizes were drawn at this point.

Joy announced that we need a new newsletter person, and new Board Member, Amy Rush, said she would take on that duty. New and returning lapsed members were asked to stand and be acknowledged.

Donna Martinson, representing the Central Flint Hills Area Quilts of Valor (Dickinson, Riley, Geary, and Clay counties), thanked the group for the blocks they provided. Donna said the blocks were used for quilts for two WWII veterans and there were enough for probably two more quilts.

Our speaker, Laura Piland, was introduced to present "Quilting Hacks From the Hardware Store". She is the designer for "Slice of Pi" quilt pattern company and also has the "Quilting and Sewing Deals" Facebook Group. After a few more door prizes, the evening meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.

The General Meeting resumed on Saturday, Oct. 1 and was called to order at 9:04 pm. The Early Bird drawing was won by Hilda Roberts, who will receive \$40 off the next meeting fees. Linda Sobba announced the next meeting will be June 2-3, 2023, in Manhattan, Ks. at the Holiday Inn Campus (just South of the KSU Student Union). Charlotte Angotti will be our National Speaker.

Rose Cantrell led a Quilts of Valor presentation for Jerry Komarek (Judy's husband) who served as a Marine. Many family members were present and a group photo was taken.

Joy presented gifts (candle lanterns) to the teachers, Laura Piland and Denise Stahl, and to Diana Schultz, the local representative for the meeting. More door prizes followed. Both workshops showed off their projects (Laura Piland's "Split Arrows" and Denise Stahl's class "Show Off Your Curves"), followed by works in progress from the UFO room.

After some Show and Tell from members, Doris Santee announced the next Golden Oldies will be July 14-16, 2023 and the Webster Conference Center. The 2024 event is also scheduled for July 19-21 at the same location. We will be celebrating 30 years of Golden Oldies in 2023. There may be a mystery quilt project and Doris reminded members to bring their signature quilts from over the years.

Alice Rush asked current and new board members to meet right before lunch for a brief meeting to set a date for the January 2023 board meeting.

Laura Piland presented her lecture and trunk show titled "Try Something New".

Veterans Quilt

Again this year, we are going to ask everyone to turn in a block. It is to show our appreciation for our veterans. Using this pattern attached here or one of your own, we ask for 12 ½" finished size blocks using quality, adult-appropriate, 100% cotton, 'quilt-weight' fabrics. Avoid branch-specific prints (Army, Navy, etc) but we please ask that you use red, white, or blue in your blocks to give a general theme to the quilt. These blocks will then be collected and sewn together and donated. The quilt will donated from us all as a group. Please feel free to turn in more than one block if you choose we would love to see everyone participate. If enough blocks are turned in, we will make as many quilts as we can from the blocks. Let's share our love of quilting with those in Kansas that have given us our freedom! A very big thank you to all those who participate!

Friendship Star Quilt Block Pattern

Friendship Star Cutting Chart

Blue Print for center

(1) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" square

Small Scale Red Print for stars

(2) 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" squares

Light Neutral Print for background

(4) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares

(2) 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" squares



Assemble the Friendship Star Quilt Block





For the 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" Friendship Star Quilt Block

- 1. Draw a diagonal line, from one corner to the opposite corner, on the reverse side of the (2) 4-7/8"X 4-7/8" light neutral squares.
- 2. Use the half-squared triangle method to sew a light square to each red print square of the same size. When complete, each of the four half-square triangle units should measure 4-1/2" x 4-1/2". Arrange the nine pieces as shown. Check to make sure the angles of all patches match the diagram.
- 3. Sew the units in each row together. Press seam allowances in the top and bottom rows towards the outer units. Press seam allowances in the center row towards the solid square.
- 4. Sew rows together, carefully matching patch edges and seam intersections.
- 5. Press. The quilt block should measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2".
