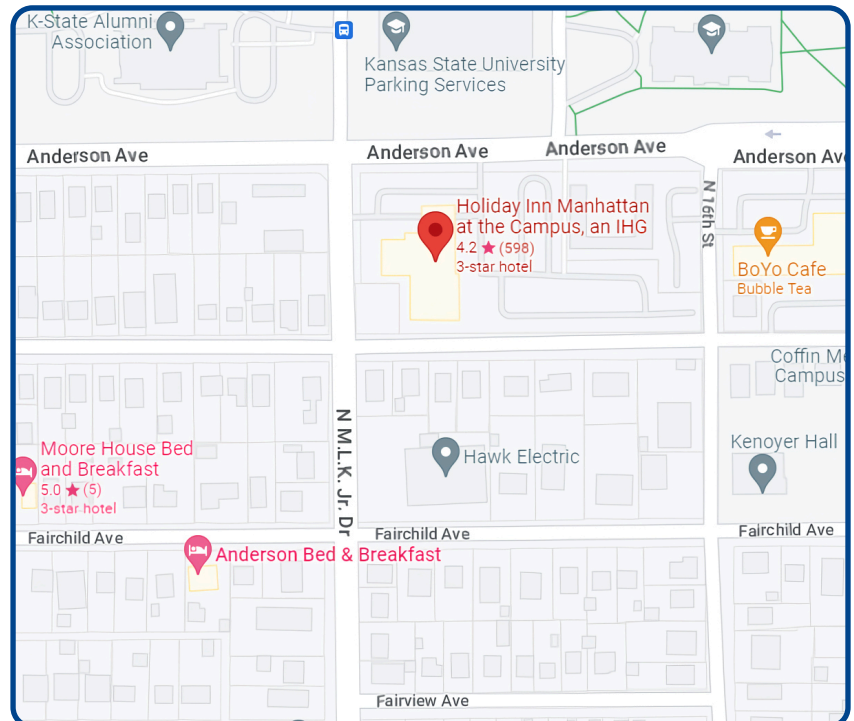

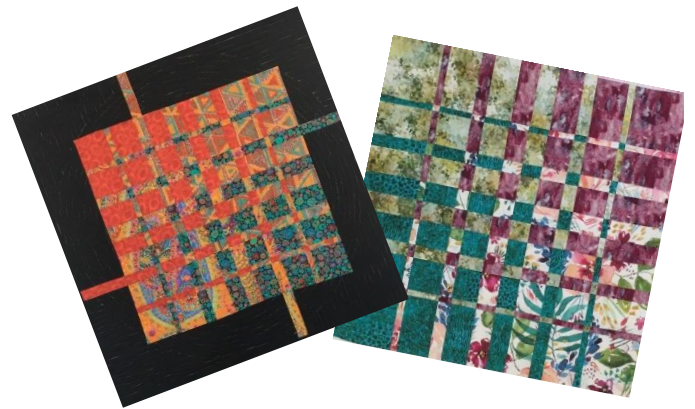

This stunning wall hanging only takes 4 Fat Quarters and a little bit of cutting and sewing. Bring a large scale print, a small scale print or two and a “read as solid” that all play well together.



Required Supplies

- Convergence by Ricky Tims (available at your LQS or from instructor for \$22)
- 4 Fat Quarters - Large scale print, small scale print and 2 read as solids that play well together.
- 6 x 24 inch ruler and rotary cutting supplies
- Sewing machine with .25 inch foot
- Matching or neutral thread
- Fabric Marker
- Pins and seam ripper just in case
- Pressing supplies

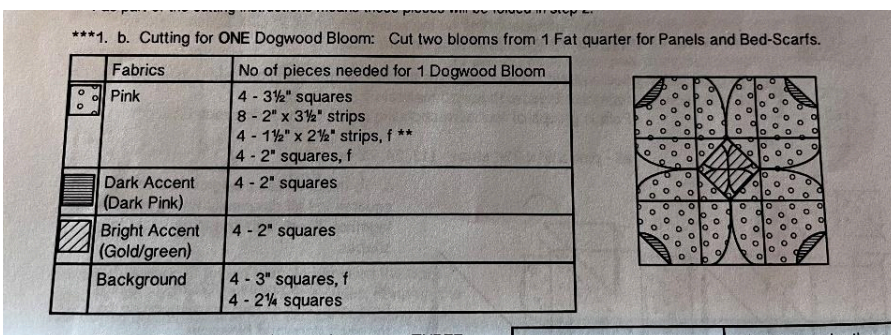
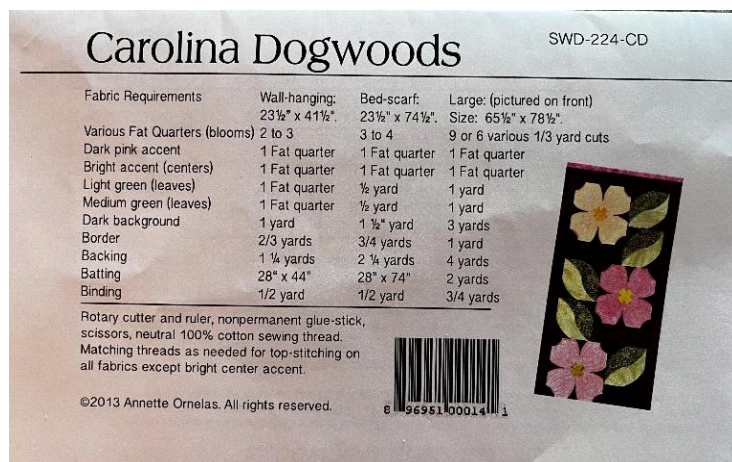
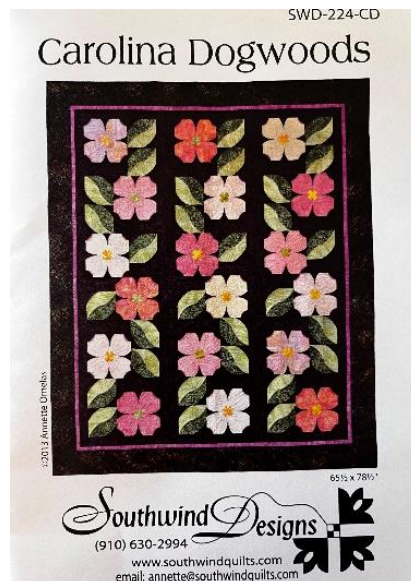
Carolina Dogwoods

This workshop will feature the delightful Carolina Dogwoods by Annette Ornelas, the owner and designer at Southwind Designs. Annette has developed an inspired technique that uses bias folds to make a dimensional curve without curved piecing. We will make a 23.5 x 41.5 inch wall hanging, but you can always make the full sized quilt.

Materials List

- Carolina Dogwoods (pattern available for \$10 from instructor)
- Sewing machine with quarter inch foot
- Rotary cutting supplies
- Pressing supplies including a pressing agent (starch or starch alternative)
- Neutral thread and top stitching thread to match all fabrics except the gold centers.
- Fabric – here are the amounts for the 3 different sizes.
- I recommend you precut fabric for at least 1 blossom. Here are the precut instructions for 1 blossom.

Quilt Coats are fun and cozy to make and wear and are very popular not only among quilters, but also in the fashion industry! In this workshop, we will start with The Elemental Coat pattern and mix it up however you would like – short, medium or long length; $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeves, full sleeves, or custom fit; hood, collar or open; pockets or not. Your Jacket - Your Way!

Cheri' will bring a variety of Kantha quilts for you to choose from! Kanthas are beautiful lightweight India quilts with gauze-like vibrant cotton fabrics layered and stitched with big sashiko stitches. They are lightweight and just right to add a little pizzazz to an outfit and thin enough to wear even in the summer. There will be lots of colors and designs available. Your jacket - you choose the base - they are all unique and different!

The simple modular jacket pattern is fun to make not only with the Kantha quilts but also with re-purposed quilts, vintage textiles, quilted yardage or even store bought quilts. Once we get the pattern basics down, your wardrobe is apt to have a whole new look. These are loose fitting with many options - you just have to choose your hem length, sleeve length, hood or collar, and even the pockets are optional! Your jacket - your way!! This is the perfect jacket to bring together the quilt makers, textile collectors and garment designers. Bring a non-quilty friend – they just might get hooked on quilting while immersed in this fun weekend!

We will bring a little quilty fun into this project as you'll learn my tips for precision bias binding.

Your kit will include the pattern and pattern ease. You will be able to purchase and choose the Kantha and coordinating fabrics for trim from Cheri' at the beginning of the class. Extra Kantha's will be available for your future jackets.

Don't worry if you haven't made garments before. This coat goes together so simply that you don't need any garment sewing experience. You also don't need quilting experience! The perfect bridge between garment makers and quilters - let us unite and just have fun!

The Kantha fabrics are layers of cotton just perfect for summer to add a little pizzazz to an outfit. This might just be your favorite "car coat" for going out to dinner and into an air conditioned building.



Supply list:

Sewing machine - complete with foot pedal, power cord, bobbin

A walking foot and edge foot/stitch in the ditch foot are nice to have

Thread - bring a few neutral colors

Rotary cutter / mat / long ruler – we can share a few if you want

Scissors - serrated are awesome for this project

Pins / clips

Seam ripper

Pen / pencil

Ironing station will be available

Your favorite sewing notions - there's always that one gal who misses their favs!

Your kit with the pattern, Kantha quilt of your choice, trim fabric, and supplies to finish the project, will be available on the day of the workshop. The kit will be \$75.00 cash payable to the speaker at the beginning of the class. If you bring your own quilt (at least a twin size), the kit will be \$50.00 cash. Everyone will have an opportunity to pick out a Kantha quilt for their project and any left over Kanthas will be sold to those wanting extras!

The program included a slide show and trunk show and demonstrated a partial seam technique. The Hexagon Runner class from the Friday workshop showed their works in progress.

After a short break at 10:05, Debbie Coddington's name was drawn as the winner of the Early Bird Prize.

The Wool Applique class taught by Debbie Coddington showed their needle cases from their workshop.

New members

We were very excited to introduce our new members Donna Sandberg, Donna Crane, Lisa Whitmore, and Cindy Mahoney.

Old Business

The Minutes from the Spring General Meeting were approved as published in the Newsletter.

Lynn Colquhoun said there were 21 blocks to be distributed for Veterans Quilts and showed several tops incorporating our blocks plus a quilt for her husband.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Debbie Coddington. She first encouraged people to invite their friends to attend meetings as our expenses have really gone up and attendance has been down. She also reminded members that it is a good time to renew before rates go up to \$30/year or \$75/three years. Our current Checking balance is \$9,463.17 before expenses for this meeting. Our income was \$5,835.00, not including some late registrations. The CD was split into two \$5,500 CDs, for a total of \$11,000.00. Linda Sobba moved, and Amy Rush seconded the Treasurer's Report be approved. Motion passed.

Spring Meeting

Denise Stahl, Lawrence, KS, will be our speaker for the Spring Meeting in Manhattan KS on June 7 and 8, 2024 at the Holiday Inn Campus. We still need a second workshop, so let a board member know if you would like to teach or know of someone.

Veterans Quilt

Again this year, we are going to ask everyone to turn in a block. It is to show our appreciation for our veterans. Using this pattern attached here or one of your own, we ask for 12 ½” finished size blocks using quality, adult-appropriate, 100% cotton, 'quilt-weight' fabrics. Avoid branch-specific prints (Army, Navy, etc) but we please ask that you use red, white, or blue in your blocks to give a general theme to the quilt. These blocks will then be collected and sewn together and donated. The quilt will be donated from us all as a group. Please feel free to turn in more than one block if you choose we would love to see everyone participate. If enough blocks are turned in, we will make as many quilts as we can from the blocks. Let's share our love of quilting with those in Kansas that have given us our freedom! A very big thank you to all those who participate!

Friendship Star Quilt Block Pattern

Friendship Star Cutting Chart

Blue Print for center

(1) 4-1/2” x 4-1/2” square

Small Scale Red Print for stars

(2) 4-7/8” x 4-7/8” squares

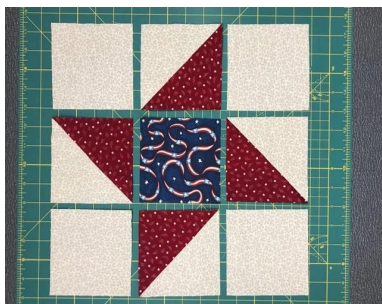
Light Neutral Print for background

(4) 4-1/2” x 4-1/2” squares

(2) 4-7/8” x 4-7/8” squares



Assemble the Friendship Star Quilt Block



For the 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" Friendship Star Quilt Block

1. Draw a diagonal line, from one corner to the opposite corner, on the reverse side of the (2) 4-7/8" X 4-7/8" light neutral squares.
2. Use the half-squared triangle method to sew a light square to each red print square of the same size. When complete, each of the four half-square triangle units should measure 4-1/2" x 4-1/2". Arrange the nine pieces as shown. Check to make sure the angles of all patches match the diagram.
3. Sew the units in each row together. Press seam allowances in the top and bottom rows towards the outer units. Press seam allowances in the center row towards the solid square.
4. Sew rows together, carefully matching patch edges and seam intersections.
5. Press. The quilt block should measure 12-1/2" x 12-1/2".
